# The Book of Ezekiel "Ezekiel's Call- Part 3" Week 5: March 1, 2020 Ezekiel 3:16-27 Answers

## **Recap from Session 4:**

# Ezekiel 3: The Preparation of the Prophet

- Being a priest, Ezekiel knew that the Hebrew Scripture pictured God's Word as food to be received within the <u>Heart</u> and <u>Digested</u> inwardly.
- No man ought to <u>Preach</u> the Word whose heart is <u>Not</u> in it and who does not believe every word he says. The pulpit is the place to <u>Declare</u> God's Word.
- Ezekiel declared God's Word as a <u>Messenger</u> (3:4-9), A <u>Sufferer</u> (3:10-15), a <u>Watchman</u> (3:16-21), and a <u>Sign</u> (3:22-27).
  - o The Messenger (Vss. 4-9)
    - Speaking
    - Receiving
    - Obeying
  - o The Sufferer (Vss. 10-15)
    - The **Spirit of God** lifted the prophet up and took him to the place where the captives were gathered together and probably praying.
    - It is <u>Not</u> simply enough to <u>Proclaim</u> the message of God; we must also <u>Seek</u> to have the <u>Caring</u> heart of God.

#### Session 5

# 1. The Watchman (Vss. 16-21)

- a. The watchmen on the walls were important to the <u>Safety</u> of the <u>City</u>, and the image shows up frequently throughout scripture.
  - i. The emphasis here is on <u>Judgment</u> while in <u>Ezekiel 33</u> it is on hope, but the message is the same: The prophet must be <u>Faithful</u> to warn the people of judgment, and the people must <u>Heed</u> the warning and <u>Turn</u> from their sin.
  - ii. Spiritually speaking, the wall that protected Israel was their <u>Covenant</u> relationship with the Lord.
- b. Vss. 18-21: There are Four Cases that we need to discuss.
  - i. The <u>Habitual</u> Sinner who is not warned (Vs. 18)
  - ii. The Sinner who is warned but **Does not** repent (Vs. 19)
  - iii. The Righteous man who Apostatizes but is not warned (Vs. 20)
  - iv. The Righteous man who is Warned and Remains righteous (Vs. 21)
- c. "Fall from Grace?"
  - i. Vs. 20 and Gal. 5:4
    - 1. This is <u>Not</u> speaking of salvation but of those who have been saved by grace but have <u>Fallen</u> down to a <u>Legal</u> level and are attempting to live by the <u>Law</u> instead of living by <u>Grace</u>.
- d. "Under Grace"

- i. We are constituted <u>Righteous</u> by faith in Jesus Christ. We are <u>Saved</u> by grace through faith. (Rom. 4:5)
- ii. The true believer today may fall into sin, but he will not deliberately **Practice** and **Live** in sin. (I Jn. 3:9)
  - 1. If a believer falls into sin, a gracious provision is made- we have an <u>Advocate</u> with the Father- and we can come to Him in confession of our sins.
- **e.** Ezekiel is the prophet of human responsibility. He presented Four Scenarios as mentioned above.
  - i. Scenario #1: The people **Dying** because the watchman.
    - 1. Their blood would be on the watchman's hands and he would be held accountable. (Ezek. 3:18; Ezek. 18:13)
  - ii. Scenario #2: The Watchman being faithful to <u>Warn</u> the wicked, but they Refuse to listen (Ezek. 3:19)
  - iii. Scenario #3: The Righteous dying because they turned from their covenant Obedience and the watchman Did Not warn them. (Ezek. 3:20)
  - iv. Scenario #4: The Righteous <u>Heeding</u> the watchman's warning and not being <u>Judged</u>. (Ezek. 3:21)
    - 1. These four examples were given to Jewish people under the old covenant and have to do with obedience to the law and the danger of physical death.
    - 2. The <u>Righteousness of the Law</u> was <u>External</u>, but the Righteousness we have through <u>Faith</u> in Jesus Christ is <u>Internal</u>, and the two must not be confused. (Rom. 9:30-10:13)
- f. Vs. 21: The <u>Main Issue</u> of a watchman was not to deliver results, but to give warning. What those warned do with that warning is <u>Not Your</u> responsibility. The role of the watchman is an <u>Informational</u> Role.

## 2. The Sign (Vss. 22-27)

- a. Ezekiel not only **Spoke** God's Word to the people, but he also **Lived** before them in such a way that they saw God's message portrayed before their very eyes.
  - i. You will find the prophet performing twelve <u>"Action Sermons"</u> to convey God's truth to people who were becoming more and more deaf to the voice of God.

## b. What About Glory?

- i. Glory is something that produces a Sensation on all of our senses.
  - 1. Glory has Size. (Ps. 19:1)
  - 2. Glory has Beauty to it. (Isa. 63:1)
  - 3. There is Majesty about Glory. (Ps. 8:1)
  - 4. Glory sets forth Honor and Dignity. (Dan. 5:18)
- ii. The Impact of Glory
  - 1. It <u>Mounted</u> up from the threshold to the Eastern Gate of the Temple's Outer court (Ezek. 10:15)
  - 2. It went <u>Up</u> from the midst of the city to the <u>Mount of Olives</u> on the East side of the city (Ezek. 11:22)
  - 3. But it will <u>Return</u> to fill the <u>New</u> Temple and <u>Cleanse</u> the people (Ezek. 44:4)
