The Book of Ezekiel "Ezekiel's Call- Part 2" Week 4: February 23, 2020 Ezekiel 3:1-15 Answers

Recap from Session 3:

- The Babylonian Captivity actually took place in <u>Three</u> sieges, but it had been extensively prophesied well in advance. (Isa. 29:5-7)
- 1. The Call of the Prophet
 - a. Apparently after the vision Ezekiel had seen, he was not standing up, but was down on his face. He will now receive a <u>Call</u>, a <u>Commission</u>, and an **Endowment**.
 - **b.** Vs. 3: God says they are a "Rebellious Nation." They have rebelled against Him and they are "Impudent Children."
 - i. "Nation-" Israel is usually contrasted with the "Nations." They have become "Lo-ammi," "Not the people of God."
 - c. Vs. 4: "I do send unto them" When God calls, He Empowers
 - d. Vs. 6: Moses admonished the Jews to <u>Live</u> on God's Word as well as the bread (Manna) that the Lord supplied <u>Daily</u> (<u>Duet. 8:3; Matt. 4:4</u>).
 - i. But having seen the glorious <u>Throne</u> of the <u>Sovereign</u> Lord, Ezekiel knew that he had all the help he needed to obey the will of God.
 - ii. The only Motivation that Never fails is doing All for the Glory of God.

Session 4:

The Preparation of the Prophet

- Vs. 1: No man ought to <u>Preach</u> the Word whose heart is <u>Not</u> in it and who does not believe every word he says. The pulpit is the place to <u>Declare</u> God's Word.
- Digesting His Words
 - Vss. 2-3: The Word of God <u>Reveals</u> a Person to you and then you fall in love with Him.

Declaring the Word of the Lord (3:4-27)

- What the people needed more than anything else was to hear the Word of the Lord! Even <u>Before</u> the Nation fell, Jeremiah had warned them not to listen to the false prophets, but neither the leaders nor the common people would obey.
 - God had spoken <u>Loudly</u> in Israel's shameful <u>Defeat</u> and <u>Captivity</u>, but now the Jews were still clinging to empty hopes and listening to the lying words.
 - The human heart would rather <u>Hear</u> lies that bring <u>Comfort</u> than truth that bring <u>Conviction</u> and <u>Cleaning</u>.
- Ezekiel declared God's Word as a <u>Messenger</u> (3:4-9), A <u>Sufferer</u> (3:10-15), a <u>Watchman</u> (3:16-21), and a <u>Sign</u> (3:22-27).

1. The Messenger (Vss. 4-9)

- a. <u>Speaking (Vs. 4)</u>- The latter part of **Vs. 4** was God's commission. Ezekiel was the <u>Messenger</u>, the People of Israel was the <u>Audience</u>, and the Word of God was the <u>Message</u> to be delieverd.
 - i. One of the Old Testament words for preaching was "Kerusso," which means "To Proclaim as a herald."
 - ii. <u>If</u> Ezekiel wanted to be a faithful herald, <u>Every</u> part of God's commission had to be obeyed even to the last detail.

b. Receiving (Vss. 5-7)

i. To receive the Word of God means to <u>Understand</u> it and take into the heart and the mind. (Matt. 13:19)

c. Obeying (Vss. 7-9)

- i. Why would God send Ezekiel if He knew the people would not listen? So that God might be **Just** when He **Judges**.
 - As long as Jerusalem had not <u>Fallen</u>, Ezekiel's message would be to His people, <u>Admonishing</u> them to flee idolatry and return to the Lord!
- ii. For the remnant that did hear him, that was valuable; but the period of **Grace** finally ran out and God's **Judgment** fell on the city of Jerusalem, and the rest of the people were brought into captivity.
 - 1. That is the point of time when Ezekiel's message **Shifted**.
- iii. God does not send His messengers to His people to entertain them or give them good advice. He **Expects** us to obey what He **Commands**.
- iv. No other nation has been blessed by God as Israel has been blessed, for the Jews had God's <u>Holy</u> law, the <u>Covenants</u>, a <u>Wealthy</u> land, the <u>Temple</u>, and the prophets to give them warnings and promises they needed. (Rom. 9:1-5)
 - 1. God assured His prophet that He would give him all he needed to withstand their **Opposition** and **Disobedience**.
- v. Vs. 8: In this verse, there is a play on words involving Ezekiel's name, which means "God is strong" or "God strengthens." It also means "God Hardens." If the people harden their hearts and faces, God will harden His servant and keep him faithful to his mission.

2. The Sufferer (Vss. 10-15)

- **a.** The **Spirit of God** lifted the prophet up and took him to the place where the captives were gathered together and probably praying.
- **b.** As the Spirit began to work, Ezekiel heard behind him several sounds:
 - i. The Rustling of the Cherubim's Wings
 - ii. The Whirring of the Wheels
 - iii. "And a noise of a great Rushing" like an earthquake.
- **c.** He knew that God's glorious Throne was **Moving** and the Lord was **Working** out His purposes.
- d. It is a good thing for the servant of God to be among his people, to <u>Weep</u> with those who weep and <u>Rejoice</u> with those who rejoice, for he can <u>Better</u> minister to them when he knows their <u>Hearts</u>, and feels their <u>Pain</u>.

i. It is <u>Not</u> simply enough to <u>Proclaim</u> the message of God; we must also <u>Seek</u> to have the <u>Caring</u> heart of God.
