# Lesson 14: The Truth About the False-Part 2 "False Prophesy/False Piety" Ezekiel 13:1-14:11 (ANSWERS)

#### November 8, 2020

#### Recap from Lesson 13:

- 1. False Confidence (12:1-28)
  - a. He, the Lord, warned him that he would be ministering to a <u>Rebellious</u> people (Ezek. 2:3-8) who were spiritually **Blind** and **Deaf**.
  - b. The Leaders Cannot Escape (Vss. 1-16)
    - i. The Lord instructed Ezekiel to <u>Play</u> the part of a <u>Fugitive</u> escaping from a **Besieged** City.
  - c. The People will Live in Terror (Vss. 17-28)
    - i. He was illustrating the <u>Tragic</u> condition of the people in Jerusalem during the Babylonian siege.
    - ii. The theme of Ezekiel's message (12:21-28) was the <u>Certainty</u> and the <u>Nearness</u> of God's judgment on Jerusalem and the land of Judah.
  - d. There is No Substitute for God's Word!

#### Session 14

#### Introduction:

- Ezekiel had answered the shallow, selfish thinking of the exiles and the people in
  Jerusalem, but now he attacked the source of their blind optimism: The Message of the
  False Prophets.
- 1. The Lying Prophets (Vss. 1-16)
  - a. Four times in this paragraph God declares that the false prophets saw the (Nothingness) and spoke lies. (Jer. 23:21-22)
  - **b.** They spoke out of their own <u>Imaginations</u>, and their <u>"Inspirations"</u> was self-induced.
    - i. Ezekiel compared them to the <u>Foxes</u> (Jackals) that lived as scavengers in the deserted ruins of the land.
    - **ii.** Ezekiel also compared the false prophets to **Workmen** who failed to build something that would last.
  - c. A true prophet tells people what they <u>Need</u> to hear, but a false prophets tell them what they <u>Want</u> to hear. (2 Tim. 4:1-5)
    - i. A <u>True</u> servant of God builds carefully on a <u>Strong</u> foundation and keeps the walls in good <u>Repair</u> but a <u>Hireling</u> builds carelessly and whitewashes things to make them <u>Look</u> better.
  - d. It is a serious thing to be **Called** by God and to **Speak** His Word to His People.
    - i. To <u>Assume</u> a place in ministry without being called and gifted is arrogance.
- 2. The Lying Sorceresses (Vss. 17-23)
  - **a.** The gift of prophecy was <u>Not</u> given exclusively to <u>Men</u>, for several prophetesses are named in Scripture.

- i. Miriam- Ex. 15:20
- ii. Deborah-Judg. 4:4-5
- iii. The Wife of Isaiah- Isa. 8:3
- iv. Huldah- 2 Ki. 22:14
- v. The Daughters of Philip the Evangelist- Acts 21:8-9
- vi. Noadiah (Self-professed)- Neh. 6:14
- **b.** They practiced the <u>Magical</u> arts they had probably learned in Babylon, all of which were **Forbidden** of the Jews (**Deut. 18:9-14**).
  - i. Instead of <u>Condemning</u> the evil and <u>Rewarding</u> the good, they were Slaying the good and <u>Rewarding</u> the evil!

## Chapter 14:1-11 "False Piety"

- 1. He Exposed Their Hidden Sin (Vss. 1-5)
  - a. <u>Outwardly</u> they were serving the Lord, but secretly they were worshipping <u>Idols</u>. Instead of having a love for God and His Word in their hearts, the elders had idols in their hearts.
- 2. He Called Them to Repent (Vss. 6-11)
  - a. <u>Repentance</u> is a change of mind and heart, it means turning <u>From</u> sin and turning <u>To</u> the Lord.
  - **b.** Once repentance takes place, individuals will notice the power found in Jesus Christ!
    - i. It is the <u>Condition</u> of the person's heart that <u>Determines</u> the response to the Lord's test, for God deals with people according to their <u>Hearts</u>.
