The Book of Ezekiel Chapters 15-17: Pictures of Failure (Part 3) Lesson 17 "The Unfaithful Wife" (Part 2) Ezekiel 16:35-47 (ANSWERS) January 3, 2021

Recap from Lesson 16:

Background:

- This long chapter contains some of the most vivid language found anywhere in Scripture.
 It is addressed to the City of Jerusalem but refers to the entire Nation.
 - This chapter traces the spiritual history of the Jews from <u>"Birth"</u> (God's call of Abraham) through <u>"Marriage"</u> (God's covenant with the people), and up to the <u>"Spiritual Prostitution"</u> (Idolatry) and the sad consequences that followed (Ruin and Exile).
- 1. Israel Experienced a Great Love (Ezek. 16:1-4)
 - **a.** Israel is pictured here as an <u>Unwanted child</u>- Exposed, <u>Abandoned</u>, and left to die, but she was then <u>Rescued</u> by the Lord and became His wife.
 - **b.** The parents of the newborn child did not even give her the human treatment that every baby deserves.
 - i. The Lord passed by, saw the helpless body, took pity on her, and <u>Saved</u> her. By the <u>Power</u> of His Word He gave her life, and this was wholly an act of <u>Divine</u> grace. (Acts 7:2).
- 2. Israel Committed a Great Sin (Ezek. 16:15-34)
 - a. When Israel became <u>Prosperous</u> and famous, she <u>Forgot</u> the Lord who gave her such great <u>Wealth</u>, and she began to use God's generous gifts for <u>Worshipping</u> idols. (Hos. 2:8, 13-14)
- The Lord <u>Desires</u> and <u>Deserves</u> our full and complete devotion. (2 Cor. 11:1-4)
- Rev. 2:4, "Nevertheless I have somewhat <u>Against</u> thee, because thou has <u>Left</u> thy first Love."

Lesson 17

- 1. Israel Suffered a Great Discipline (Ezek. 16:35-47)
 - a. The Lord was very patient with His people and warned them that their sins would bring them ruin, but they persisted in **Rejecting** His Word, **Persecuting** His prophets, and **Practicing** the abominable sins of their neighbors.
 - **b.** Their punishments are described as those of a <u>**Prostitute**</u>, an <u>**Adulteress**</u>, and an <u>**Idolater**</u>, because the nation had committed those very sins.
 - c. Ezekiel gives a graphic description of the judgment of Israel, the prostitute.
 - i. First, the Lord would announce the <u>Crimes</u> (Vss. 35-36). She "Poured out her lust" on the heathen idols and exposed her nakedness in worshipping them.
 - ii. Then the Lord announced the Sentence (Vss. 37-42).
 - 1. She would be publicly exposed as an Adulteress and a Harlot.
 - a. Like adulterers and adulteresses, the people would be killed by **Stones**; like idolaters, they would be slain by the

<u>Sword</u>, and like prostitutes, they would be **<u>Burned</u>** in the fire.

- Having described their sins, the Lord then <u>Defended</u> His <u>Sentence</u> (Ezek. 16:43-52).
 - 1. First, the nation had <u>Forgotten</u> what the Lord had done for them (Vs. 43), and this was the very sin that Moses had warned them to avoid. (Deut. 6:10)
 - **a.** When we <u>Forget</u> to be thankful, we are in <u>Danger</u> of taking <u>Credit</u> of our blessings and <u>Failing</u> to give God the glory He deserves.
 - 2. Second, they <u>Failed</u> to understand the <u>Enormity</u> of their sin (Ezek. 16:44-52).
 - a. "Like father, like son." Another version might be "The apple does not fall too far from the tree."
 - **b.** In other words, the children inherit their parents' <u>Nature</u>, so don't be surprised if they <u>Repeat</u> their parent's sins.
- 2. God Names the Sins of Sodom (Vss. 48-52)
 - a. These were abominable sins of <u>Attitude</u> and <u>Action</u>, <u>Commission</u> and <u>Omission</u>; and yet the people of Jerusalem and Judah were more guilty than were the people of Sodom.
- 3. Israel Will Experience a Great Restoration (Vss. 53-63)
 - a. The phrase "Bring again their captivity" means "Restore their Fortress." The captives in Babylon would be restored, returned to the land, and rebuild the temple.
 - i. God's goodness in allowing this to happen would bring them to **Shame** and **Repentance** (Rom. 2:4).
 - **b.** However, it is likely that this restoration is **Reserved** for the end times when Israel will see their **Messiah**, **Weep** over their sins, and enter into His **Kingdom**.
 - i. Later in his book, (Ezek. 37:15-28), Ezekiel will <u>Predict</u> a reunion of Samaria (The Northern Kingdom) and <u>Judah</u> (The Southern Kingdom) under the <u>Kingship</u> of the Messiah.
 - The Jewish people broke their covenant and suffered for their disobedience, but <u>Nobody</u> can be <u>Saved</u> by keeping the law. (Gal. 2:16)
 - 2. It is only through the Redemption provided in Christ Jesus that sinners can be forgiven and received into the family of God. (Rom. 3:24)
 - ii. There will come a time when God's people, Israel, will remember their sins and recognize God's goodness and grace on their behalf.
 - 1. Their mouths will be **Shut** because of Conviction **(Ezek. 16:63)** and they will be **Saved**.
- One day, that <u>New Covenant</u> will bring to them the <u>Cleansing</u> and <u>Forgiveness</u> that only the blood of Christ can give!
